State laws & federal regulations!





Example 1: Drinkware

- ✓ 250 tumblers for a Maine college
- ✓ Supplier says bottles meet FDA regulations
- Find out bottles were recalled by the state
- ✓ What happened?





States with some form of BPA Ban

Suppliers must be aware...

All drinkware **must** be registered with FDA's Food Contact Notification Program



USE CAUTION

 See all relevant test results
Check regulations of specific state

Example 2: Bags

Ordered 5,000 tote bags Bags exceed toxin levels in 19 states Client fined thousands of dollars!



What could have been done?

- 1. Do your research
- 2. Know the varying laws
- Metals added unintentionally must also be checked < 100 ppm
 Reusable bags are included

Example 3: Writing Instruments

✓ Ordered 500 pens Client runs tests Imprint ink contains traces of lead beyond client's requirements!

What could have been done?

- Get results for the ink as well as the pen
- 2. Be cautious with in-house testing
- 3. Know what questions to ask



Writing instruments have unique rules

Toxic Substances Control Act Labeling of Hazardous Art Materials Act Sufficiently sized air holes in caps



Rules to remember

GCC: General Certificate of Conformity CPSIA: Regulates products for children age 12 or younger

- Phtalates < 1,000 ppm</p>
- Lead in surface coatings < 90 ppm</p>
- Total lead < 100 ppm</p>
- Cadmium in jewelry < 75 ppm</p>



Rules to remember

Prop 65: Best practice is to comply no matter the state Many state-specific laws

- Lead Poisoning Act (IL)
- Children's Safe Product Act (WA)
- Toxic Chemicals in Children's Products (ME)
